The evening witnessed an impressive gathering of over 200 stakeholders, including key dignitaries such as Shri Jivesh Kumar Mishra, Minister of Urban Development and Housing Department, and Shri Vivek Kumar Singh, Chairman of RERA Bihar. The ceremony paid tribute to the outgoing team for their dedicated efforts during 2023–2025, with mementos presented in recognition of their service. This was followed by the formal facilitation and introduction of the new office bearers, signalling a renewed commitment to sustainable growth and industry representation.

Strategic insights were shared by the incoming Chairman, Shri Shailendra Singh, who stressed the importance of “collaborative governance” in addressing Bihar’s evolving urban challenges. Shri Jivesh Kumar Mishra, in his address as Chief Guest, acknowledged CREDAI’s vital role in shaping the state’s infrastructure landscape, while RERA Chairman Shri Vivek Kumar Singh highlighted the urgency of streamlining regulations to ensure smoother operations within the sector.

The event also served as a platform to unveil CREDAI Bihar’s policy priorities for the term. These include advocating land pooling models inspired by Delhi and Hyderabad to enable systematic urban expansion; pushing for swift zonal demarcation under the Master Plan 2047 in alignment with India’s long-term development goals; and proposing an amnesty scheme to regularize non-compliant structures, thereby boosting both revenue and employment. Additionally, the need for RERA procedural reforms was highlighted, with workshops suggested to bridge existing gaps in understanding and implementation.

CREDAI Bihar also reiterated the real estate sector’s significant contribution to the state’s economy, accounting for nearly 25% of the GDP and supporting over 300 allied industries. A strong case was made for GST rationalization to improve housing affordability, stimulate demand, and drive broader job creation, underscoring CREDAI’s continued commitment to inclusive growth and sustainable development in Bihar.

Tax benefits, infra boost outside metros drive a second home boom

As metro home sizes shrink, second homes — primarily used for recreation at the peripheries of metro cities — are gaining traction as a dual-purpose investment. Offering tax benefits for non-resident Indians (NRIs) and an appealing alternative to traditional buyers, these properties are increasingly seen as a strategic financial asset.

"Over the past two years, sales of planned developments and holiday homes have surged by approximately 15-20 per cent in emerging second-home destinations. Locations within a 100-150 km radius of metro cities have witnessed a 20-30 per cent rise in buyer interest, driven by improved infrastructure and enhanced connectivity," said Boman Irani, president of the Confederation of Real Estate Developers' Associations of India (CREDAI), the national association of Indian real estate developers.

Indian cities are also witnessing a surge in demand for second homes with expansive green spaces. In Bangalore, Noida Hills and Gurgaon near Sarinagar/Indira Park are emerging hotspots. Chennai's Mahalingapuram and Kovilambal Road on IICC attract buyers with beachfront properties. Mumbai sees strong demand in Alibaug and Kurla, while Pune shows interest in Lonavala. In Delhi, farmhouse in Chhatarpur and Nehruvill-Gurgaon Road (Gurgaon) continue to be popular.

The average ticket size for second homes typically ranges between ₹1 crore and ₹3.5 crore.

Home ownership and home sale remain investment, particularly in the second-home market," said Anil Patel, chairman, Anarock Group.

"Added incentives, such as income tax relief on second homes introduced in Budget 2023, have further boosted their attractiveness as both lifestyle upgrades and sound investments," said Sandeep Ahuja, chief executive officer (CEO), Altamira Living.

High net worth individuals (HNIs) invest in vacation or second homes as their preferred wealth destinations and retirement homes for future living after concluding their professional careers, said market analyst. They also noted that many wealthy Indians maintain second homes in multiple cities for convenience and to be closer to their businesses and families.

The factors are driving real estate in the space to fuel up their presence and create some unique selling features to stand out of the crowd. Shalin Katoia, managing director (MD), residential services, CoStar & Wackerlin, noted that improved infrastructure and connectivity, such as expressways and direct flights to key second-home destinations, will further boost demand.

Katoia added, "Additionally, enhancing healthcare access in these locations will be crucial, particularly for senior citizens. Lastly, policies that support sustainable development and incentive real estate investments in emerging second-home markets will contribute to the segment's long-term growth."

Kanishk Singh, vice president, sales, marketing and CRM at Sufra Group pointed out the rising number of women owning the housing market, driven by government incentives. Vikas Kataria, founder of Mumbai-based Irelis Lifestyle, observed a rising demand for luxury villa projects that prioritize well-being-focused amenities and natural surroundings, making them an increasingly popular choice for second-home buyers.

RBI rate cut to boost housing sales with lower loan rates: Credai, Naredco

Housing Bodies 'Take Rates on home loans likely to come down

- Will stimulate real estate demand

HOUSING sales will be following the RBI's decision to cut the repo rate as interest rates on home loans are likely to come down, according to real estate bodies Credai and Naredco.

The two associations, which have more than 16,000 developers as members, welcomed the RBI's move to reduce the repo rate by 25 basis points.

"At a time of global economic volatility caused by increasing tariffs and geopolitical tensions, this move reflects a continued shift toward a pro-growth stance amid easing inflation and a stabilising macroeconomic outlook," said Boman Irani, CREDAI National President.

"With the reduction in borrowing costs, more aspirational homebuyers may enter the market, which will help bridge the demand-supply gap in the sector. Commercial real estate will also benefit, as easier financing may encourage businesses to expand and invest in office and retail spaces," the Naredco president said. Chetan K. said the RBI's decision reflects a strong growth outlook and gives a much-needed boost to real estate sentiment. Housing sales have fallen in the first quarter of the 2025 calendar year because of high prices, lower launches and economic growth uncertainties.

Real estate data analysts from PropTiger data found that housing sales declined 23 per cent annually to nearly 100 lakh units during January-March across nine major cities. Housing sales will 28 per cent in the January-March period across seven metro cities to 61.26 lakh units, according to Anarock. Among developers, Varunesh Gupta/Arshad, Director, Group Promoter's Office and CEO of Shapoorji Pallonji Real Estate (SPRE), described it as a positive development for the real estate sector.

"Lower interest rates will make home loans affordable, which may boost housing demand across categories. This will result in increased residential sales, better liquidity in the market, and a gradual depletion of unsold inventory," said G Nandha, Naredco National President.

"With the reduction in borrowing costs, more aspirational homebuyers may enter the market, which will help bridge the demand-supply gap in the sector. Commercial real estate will also benefit, as easier financing may encourage businesses to expand and invest in office and retail spaces," the Naredco president said.
